Hotels are like cars: Newer models can dazzle with flashy looks and marketing hype, but only after you test-drive them does their true performance come to light. After scrutinizing the thousands of hotels that opened in the last year, we checked in to the most promising—incognito, of course—appraising the location, service, design, and value. We came across our fair share of lemons. But the 136 properties that won us over are the most global group yet. Spanning a record 53 countries (including new-to-the-list destinations Easter Island, Romania, and Rwanda), they range in size from a three-suite safari camp in South Africa's Londolozi Private Game Reserve to a 3,000-room tower on Macau's Cotai Strip, and in price from \$70 for a winsome inn near Angkor Wat to \$3,900 for a three-tent pool villa in the Maldives, complete with massage table and personal butler. What makes a hotel a keeper? Read on.

THE WORLD Queen Victoria

Ramos. Its sunlit living area features a Bose iPod docking station and stylish loungers, while double-glaze laminated glass provides soundproofing. Plenty of closet space and an expansive sunken rain shower enhance this room's good value. All accommodations come with modern essentials like Wi-Fi and a 32-inch flatscreen television; those in search of Siem Reap's low-tech offerings can tour the food market with a Khmer-speaking French chef. When to go: December to March has the least rain (but the most tourists). Which room to book: For lovers of sculpture, the Bamboo Room; painting, the Saffron Room; and photography, the Sepia Room (855-63-965-321; hotelbeangkor .com; doubles, \$95-\$150). 3 @

Viroth's Hotel, Siem Reap

JSitting squarely in the sweet spot between cheap guesthouse and big-box hotel—and unbeatably priced—Viroth's has a simple, clean design that is accented by gray Khmer tile floors, rosewood rail-



ings, and the occasional indigenous objet or scarlet wall. The ground-floor saltwater pool (in

full view of the reception desk) may be best for exhibitionists, but the bamboowalled massage area and rooftop thatchcovered breakfast/lounge nook are more private sanctuaries. Each of the seven artfully lit rooms also has its own balcony or terrace that looks out over the street, pool, or small private courtyard. The hotel is located just across the river from the bustling Old Market; the helpful staff can arrange a tuk-tuk there or to Angkor Wat, three miles away. For dinner, walk the two blocks to Viroth's Restaurant, which the hotel's French owner opened four years ago on a moat-enclosed patio, and which serves Khmer and Western dishes. When togo: From December to March you'll encounter the least rain (but the most tourists). Which room to book: Ask for No. 7. the second-floor corner room overlooking the pool (855-63-761-720; viroth-hotel .com; doubles, \$70-\$90). @ @ @

CARIBBEAN AND ATLANTIC

Hermitage Bay, Antigua

M Down a long dirt road, this secluded resort perches between a steep slope and

a small bay. Its 25 suites—each a spacious contemporary cottage of dark wood and white linens-are tucked into lush foliage rich with birdlife and come with an outdoor shower and daybeds, as well as a flat-screen TV, an iPod docking station, and Wi-Fi; ceiling fans twirl above mosquito-netted beds. All this is the ideal setting in which to decompress fully while lounging by your plunge pool with a glass of wine from the restaurant's well-chosen cellar. The friendly staff ferry guests up and down the hillside in golf carts. A few antique Chinese tea chests, an exhibit of original black-and-white photographs of Bob Marley, and low-slung furnishings combine to give the reception area a laidback chic. With its commitment to sophistication and natural beauty, Hermitage Bay aims to join the properties at the top of the market in Antigua-and is priced accordingly. What you're paying for here is peacefulness, supremely relaxing accommodations, better than decent food, a wonderful swimming beach, and an understated yet pampering spa. When to go: Rates drop the first week of April, but hurricane season has yet to kick in. Which room to book: Beachside suites let you step out your door into the placid sea, but for drop-dead romance, book a hillside suite, the higher the better (268-562-5500; hermitagebay .com; suites, \$700-\$1,650, including meals). 🚱 🚱 🚭 🤀

Agua Resort & Spa, Dominican Republic

This romantic all-suite beachfront retreat north of the sprawling all-inclusives of Punta Cana is a diamond literally in the rough—the last two miles of the approach road are so bone rattling that it may be worth ponying up \$200 for the ten-minute helicopter transfer from the airport in Punta Cana. But behind the resort's unmarked security gate, Agua is breathtaking. The open-air lobby has a soaring peaked thatch roof, and the 53 rooms, divided between two-story thatched buildings and freestanding villas, are arranged around two snaking pools and are no more than a one-minute walk from the beach. With classic clean lines, they are dramatic by virtue of their size (the smallest is 700 square feet) and simple comforts—wicker ceilings, dark hardwood floors and furniture, white-on-white beds, immense bathrooms with black slate showers and deep soaking tubs. Alas, the food at Areito, prepared by the kitchen staff formerly at

Casa Colonial ("Hot List," May 2005), could and should be better: Crêpes come stuffed with rubbery cheese; vegetables taste as though they were fresh out of a packet. When to go: December through March remains relatively dry, and nights are cool enough to be refreshing. Which room to book: Nos. 47-52 are second-floor oceanfront suites that have decks over the Atlantic but offer the privacy that height affords (809-468-0000; aguaresort.com; doubles, \$350-\$980).

Aquamare, Virgin Gorda

M Aquamare melds the best aspects of a villa rental and a posh hotel. A house for celebration is the idea behind this trio of glass-enclosed, shingle-roofed fivebedroom villas fronting a half mile of beach on Mahoe Bay. And though Hollywood A-listers cherishing their privacy and space (8,000 square feet per villa) have been the first to avail themselves of the enclave's concierge (who will arrange spa treatments or an excursion aboard the property's 62-foot yacht), those who will feel most at home are families or other small groups gathering for a special occasion. In addition to identical master suites in each villa (along with one double and one junior), there is an open kitchen off a high-ceilinged great room that allows everyone to help stir the soup or observe the art of the personal chef, as well as a private infinity-edge pool. Furnishings are stylishly oversized, and as much thought has been given to the texture of the decor as to the (subdued) color, something you notice while standing on the pebbled floor of your master bath's private outdoor shower, wondering-despite the double latticework-how private it really is. Which room to book: The third-floor master suite in Villa No. 1, which is closest to the sea, has the best views of the sunset and the islands of Sir Francis Drake Channel (787-461-2638; villaaquamare.com; five-bedroom villas, \$12,500-\$18,500 per week). 😡 🏶

CHILE

Explora en Rapa Nui-Posada de Mike Rapu, Easter Island

Co-owned by Explora and the prominent islander whose name it bears, Explora en Rapa Nui is unquestionably the swishest place on this volcanic island marooned some 2,300 miles west of Chile, and as with Explora's other properties, the build-
